TEARS HAVE NO COLOR: A CONVERSATION ABOUT SYRIAN REFUGEES

The Syrian Refugee issue will be revisited by a distinguished panel of speakers including, former Commissioner-General of United Nations Relief and Works Agency, current Commissioner for the Independent Commission of Inquiry on Syria at the UN Human Rights Council, and IWA 2015 Woman Extraordinaire **Karen Koning AbuZayd**, Consuls General of countries hosting the largest number of Syrian refugees, Turkey (**Hon. Umut Acar**) and Lebanon (**Hon. Bilal Kabalan**), Jordan's Honorary Consul **Ihssan Sweiss**, and MedGlobal founder, Syrian physician **Dr. Zaher Sahloul**.

The Two Million, award winning 15 minute documentary directed by Chicago-based writer/director and IWA member Derin Baratka highlighting the challenges and difficulties facing refugee families in Turkey, will also be shown at the end of the program.

- 13.1 million people are still in need inside Syria; 6.1 million internally displaced and 2.98 million in hard-toreach and besieged areas.

Directions: Swift School is located at 5900 North Winthrop, on the corner of Thorndale and Winthrop, between Sheridan and Broadway. The school is serviced by the 144 and 147 express busses from Michigan Avenue and the 151 Devon bus. Bus 36, which stops one block west, runs all the way through the Loop from Harrison. There is street parking as well as staff parking with few spaces. Car Pooling is recommended. The Red Line L services the school with the stop at Thorndale.

Swift Specialty School: K-8th grade port-of-entry school within the Chicago Public School system serving low-income, immigrant and refugee students from 55 countries speaking 65 languages and dialects.
